PRACTICAL PREPARATION

UI&U's practitioner-scholar training will prepare you to practice in multiple professional roles and contexts in the mental health field. You will be trained to provide a broad range of services to individuals, families, groups and organizations, and serve as a social advocate in a variety of systems. Our

vision is solidly grounded in the standards of professional psychology while attending to the emerging professional, economic, and cultural developments of our times. In addition to expanding your knowledge and skills in traditional models and methods, you will be introduced to current and emerging theories and approaches. With the program's integration of science and practice and its attention to social justice issues, you will be prepared for your choice of professional opportunities and activities.

PROGRAM DELIVERY

The program utilizes a *distributed learning model*, including on-ground classroom-based learning, distance electronically mediated education, and a blend of the two. Students meet throughout the year and at the biannual week-long Academic Meetings in on-ground classes and online courses. Small cohorts



of 8-12 students also meet once a month for day-long Professional Development Seminars in Cincinnati, Ohio, or Brattleboro, Vermont. Experienced faculty provide support for students' personal and interpersonal development, research, clinical training, and academic competence.
