Time to Program Completion

The Psy.D. program is a 124 credit hour degree program. The maximum amount of time allotted for a student to earn the doctorate of psychology with a concentration in clinical psychology is seven (7) years. Students are permitted to petition for a maximum of two one-year extensions beyond the seven-year limit. To obtain an extension, they need to submit a plan for completion to their Dissertation Chairperson describing the reason(s) they need an extension, the actions they will take, and a detailed timeline for these actions in order to complete the program in the following year. This plan must be reviewed and approved by their Dissertation Chairperson and then submitted to the dean for review and approval.

At present we do not have any graduates.
