### City of Cincinnati Employees and Union Institute & University



Effective Winter Semester 2010, Cincinnati Undergraduate Center will assist each City of Cincinnati employee admitted to Union Institute & University with design of a degree plan showing accepted transfer credits, accepted prior learning assessment credits and UI&U courses required to complete the degree with an expected timeline for completion. Applicants must submit official transcripts of all college work for evaluation of transfer credit.

- Effective with Winter 2010 academic term, all City of Cincinnati Employees in the UI&U Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts program will received a scholarship equal to 10% of tuition each term as long as the learner maintains satisfactory academic standing and is enrolled for at least half-time (6 credit hours each semester). Each City of Cincinnati learner will also receive a 100% scholarship to offset the tuition for the final four credit course in the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts program if the learner

has maintained continuous enrollment of at least half-time (6 credit hours or more each semester from time of enrollment until the term of the final course).

- UI&U offers all Title IV federal financial aid, State of Ohio grants for private university students as well as several university scholarships
- UI&U is prepared to evaluate all college level professional training courses offered by City of Cincinnati to its employees to determine possible academic credit to be used toward the Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Arts degree within the policies of the Bachelor of Science Program Handbook and Bachelor of Arts Program Handbook. Credit will be assigned under the policy in the UI&U Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts Handbook.
