Union Institute & University (UI&U) desires to partner with Cincinnati-Hamilton County Community Action Agency (CAA) to assist the organization in increasing academic preparedness among its employees. The successful completion of degrees by working adults helps instill an attitude of becoming lifelong learners with an increased sense of social responsibility.

Effective August 31, 2009, Cincinnati Undergraduate Center will assist each H-C CAA employee admitted to Union Institute & University with design of a degree plan showing accepted transfer credits, accepted prior learning assessment credits and UI&U courses required to complete the degree with an expected timeline for completion. Applicants must submit official transcripts of all college work for evaluation of transfer credit.

- Effective with Fall 2009 academic term, all CAA employees in the UI&U BS program will receive a scholarship equal to 10% of tuition each term as long as the learner maintains satisfactory academic standing. Each CAA learner will also receive a 100% scholarship to offset the tuition for the final four credit course in the BS program.

- UI&U offers all Title IV federal financial aid, State of Ohio grants for private university students as well as several university scholarships.

- UI&U will evaluate all college level professional training courses offered by CAA to determine possible academic credit to be used toward the BS degree within the policies of the BS Program Handbook.

- As a service to CAA employees, UI&U will offer courses onsite at CAA with a minimum of five registered learners in offered course whenever CAA provides classroom space at no cost to the university. The university will provide a Certificate of Liability Insurance naming CAA as additional insured covering use of classroom space.
